# **RECORDING HOMER GLEN**



The Village Clerk is a four year elected position which coincides with the Village President's term of office. The Village Clerk is the official keeper of the Village records and maintains the official Village files, including Ordinances, Resolutions, annexation files, and other official documents.

### **RESPONSIBILITIES**

The Village Clerk's office is responsible for providing the following services:

- Prepares and maintains the Village Board of Trustees meeting agendas and minutes
- Maintains the Village Commissions and Committees agendas and minutes
- Oversees the adoption and publishing of the Code of Ordinances
- FOIA requests
- Village collector
- Liquor License applications
- Business Registration
- Serving as the official keeper of the Village seal
- Voter Registration and election services
- Tobacco License
- Video Gaming License

The next Will County election is the Presidential Primary on March 17, 2020.

- First day to circulate petitions: September 3
- Petition Filing: November 25 – December 2

### **WHEN CAN I REGISTER TO VOTE?**

Registration is open throughout the year except during the following times:

- In-person or any mail-in registration is not available during the 27 days preceding the election
- Online registration is not available during the 15 days preceding the election

### **WHERE CAN I REGISTER TO VOTE?**

- Print and Mail in the Illinois Voter Registration Application
- In person with a Registrar (There are Registrars located at the Village Hall)
- Online using Illinois Online Voter Registration Application Website
- The Will County Clerk's Office using Grace Period Registration and Voting
- Your Polling Place on Election Day

# **PLANNING BUSINESS *in* THE GLEN**



The Community and Economic Development Committee (CED) acts as a recommending body which advises the Village Board and staff on planning for the economic health and future of the community. The CED Committee addresses issues and opportunities related to community development (i.e., comprehensive planning, growth strategies and community services) and economic development (i.e., business retention, recruitment relations and marketing).

The CED Committee has contributed to shaping several recent initiatives to facilitate economic development. The Committee weighed in on an effort to update the zoning regulations of the Village Code. This has resulted in a more user-friendly Code.

The CED Committee also made recommendations regarding new liquor classifications. This was undertaken to enable existing business owners to remain competitive and expand business recruitment opportunities to further diversify retail venues and generate new retail sales tax. The Village Board approved both the zoning regulations and liquor classifications updates to the Code at their meeting on July 10.

Another recent contribution of the CED Committee was recommendations for a comprehensive approach to new Village gateway and wayfinding signage. The Committee's guidance assisted the Village Board's consideration to include funds for this project in the current budget. As conceived, this signage initiative would update the sign design and complete a system of welcoming gateway signs



at the borders of the community and assist with internal wayfinding. The timing for this Village signage project is dependent upon completion of the IDOT road improvement project for 159th Street.

# HERITAGE PARK



## **ACTIVE CORE**

The centerpiece of Heritage Park, the Active Core, opens September 14! The Active Core's seven acres are filled with fitness equipment, play structures and nature elements for the entire family. Come explore the Active Core! Amenities include sand volleyball courts, tennis courts, pickleball courts, challenge course, sensory garden, musical play area, fitness stations, bocce ball court, horseshoe court, bags boards, and walking paths!

## **SLED HILL**

The Heritage Park sledding hill will be open for the first time this winter! The new hill is located to the northeast of the Active Core. Parking is available around Heritage Circle.

## **319 GRANT AREA - WETLAND RESTORATION**

The northern and eastern portions of Heritage Park are wetlands designed to improve flood prevention in nearby subdivisions. The area doubles as a beautiful home to native tall grasses and natural plantings. Take a stroll around the park's trails to enjoy the peaceful landscape. The project was funded by a Grant from the Environmental Protection Agency.

## **TRAIL ACCESS TO HERITAGE PARK**

This summer, the Village completed construction of the 151st Street Bike Trail and the Northwest Heritage Park Bike Trail. Both trails provide direct access to Heritage Park and connect, via on-street trails, to the Village's Heroes Trail system.

# **SIGNS OF THE TIME**



The Public Services and Safety Committee, also comprised of representatives from the Homer Township and Northwest Homer Fire Protection Districts, Will County Sheriffs Department, Homer Glen EMA, Homer Township Road District, Homer Glen Development Services Department and Building Department, makes recommendations as it pertains to ordinances which regulate life and building safety, roadway safety, property maintenance and drainage related issues.

In an effort to bring attention to a driver's speed on residential streets located in the Village, the Committee made the recommendation for the installation of yellow signage with humorous phrases. The locations were selected based on resident complaints and traffic speed data. The Committee was also responsible for the placement of speed radar devices which immediately alert drivers to their speed and provides traffic data which can be analyzed and used for additional traffic calming measures.

### **SAFETY REMINDERS: FIRE PITS**

Many people enjoy outdoor fire pits. Fire pits are often used to describe outside patio style burning confined to brick or stone enclosures, portable metal containers designed for outdoor use, or chimneys. With the growing popularity of fire pits the following are some safety guidelines for you to keep in mind while enjoying your outdoor fire pit.

- Fire pits or fires in approved containers should be kept at least 15 feet away from structures.
- Do not locate your fire pit under trees or other overhead structures that could potentially ignite because of a spark or ember.
- Always keep a garden hose, fire extinguisher, or bucket of sand nearby for extinguishing a small fire that may arise from spark or ember.
- Use kindling to start your fire; never use an accelerant.
- Only use materials approved by the manufacturer of your fire pit for burning. The burning of garbage or building materials is not allowed.
- Don't overload your fire pit; doing so can cause the fire to become too large and the potential for control of an overloaded pit troublesome. Burning fires need to be no more than three feet in diameter.
- It is recommended that you have a screen for your fire pit to contain sparks and embers.
- Keep children and pets away from the fire pit.
- Don't leave your fire pit unattended; always extinguish your fire before leaving or going indoors.
- Ashes should be stored in a metal can with a lid, away from combustibles, and disposed of after full cooling time.
- Always use your fire pit according to the manufacturer's recommendations.

### PLASTIC-FREE MONTH

On June 26, 2019, the Environment Committee prepared a Plastic-Free July promotion and continues to encourage residents to focus on ways to reduce waste, reduce plastics, and be better recyclers!

### BIG TREE CONTEST

In honor of Arbor Day, the Homer Glen Environment Committee searched for additions to the biggest trees in the Village of Homer Glen. Nominations for every species of living tree that exists were encouraged to be submitted. Verification of measurement was made by the Environment Committee. The largest tree of each species received recognition. Residents and stakeholders were encouraged to search in forests, parks, and private property with permission of the property owner in the Village of Homer Glen. To compare trees, the circumference of each tree was measured at 54 inches from the ground level. Winners of this year's contest include:

# BUSINESS 101

The Village serves the community by proactively attracting new businesses and development and assisting existing businesses to thrive and grow in the Village. The Economic Development Department is a resource center for brokers, developers, site selectors and businesses. The Department maintains an up-to-date commercial space and property inventory as a comprehensive resource on the Village's website and provides one-stop demographic and trade area information. Businesses are assisted with site selection options based on their requirements. Recruitment outreach, presentations, and tours for new business attraction are customized. The Economic Development Department is active in the International Council of Shopping Centers for recruitment opportunities and networking.

The Economic Development Department coordinates with other Village departments to provide early guidance on site plan concepts and the entitlement process. The Department will initiate efforts as needed to help resolve issues and inappropriate barriers to desirable business activity. The Department supports new businesses throughout their opening process culminating with a Mayor's ribbon cutting. The facilitation provided by Village staff means a more efficient, business-friendly and smoother process for opening

new businesses and initiating appropriate development projects in Homer Glen.

Existing businesses receive support from the Village with issues that arise. The Village serves as the liaison to 159th Street business and property owners throughout the IDOT road improvement project. The yellow business identity signs that assist customers to find business driveways during road construction are an initiative of the Village Board.

# MAINTAINING THE GLEN

# COMPREHENSIVE PLAN



In May 2019, the Village of Homer Glen launched a project to update its Comprehensive Plan. The Village’s original Comprehensive Plan was adopted in 2005, which was four years after its incorporation as a municipality in 2001. As Homer Glen has grown and changed over time, so has its priorities. These new priorities are reflected in the Village’s recent 2018-2021 Strategic Plan, which outlines six strategic priorities, three core values, a strategic vision and mission, and key outcomes for the next few years. Many of these priorities and outcomes align with the need to update the Village’s Comprehensive Plan, particularly to “align the [plan] with balanced growth, economic development, and community values.”

To guide the Homer Glen community through this planning process, the Village hired the multidisciplinary consultant team of Savoy Consulting Group, Egret+Ox Planning LLC, and Antero Group. Collectively, the consultant team will utilize its experience in comprehensive planning, zoning, housing, economic development, municipal engineering, and community engagement to frame the planning process. The consultant team plans a series of outreach activities to gather community feedback.

### *Keeping The Ground Dry This Fall*

# SOLVING DRAINAGE ISSUES

With the Fall rain season upon us many of those old drainage problems may seem to reappear. There are several things homeowners can do to help reduce or even eliminate drainage problems for themselves and their neighbors now and in the future.

First and foremost, homeowners should be aware of any drainage and utility easements located on their property and avoid any construction within these easements. This includes the construction of sheds, garages or any other structures as well as landscape walls, raised planting areas or berms. The planting of trees or other plants is acceptable within drainage easements as long as there are no changes made to the original ground elevation and the plants will not interfere with storm water drainage flows. The location of downspouts and sump pump discharges is recommended to be at least two feet from the foundation of the structure being drained, at least

two feet from any adjacent property line and perpendicular to any adjacent property line and/or along the flow line of the drainage easement. Fencing constructed within or across drainage easements must either be of a flow through design or be raised sufficiently to allow proper flow under the fence. To help reduce flooding of the streets, adjacent parkways and back yards where drainage facilities are present, homeowners can help by removing leaves and other debris from the storm drain grates.

If any homeowner is interested in making drainage improvements to their property, but is unsure if it is allowable or will cause drainage problems for themselves or their neighbors, please feel free to contact the Village's Development Services Department for help to review your project and answer any questions you may have before you begin.

# PROTECTING *with* PERMITS

## OPEN LEAF BURNING: PERMIT REQUIRED

The Village of Homer Glen's Village Code requires a permit for the Open Burning of Leaves. The permit is free of charge and is valid for six (6) months. Upon issuance, the applicant will be given a permit card which must be displayed. Residents are required to comply with the adopted rules and regulations for Open Leaf Burning.

- Notify your adjacent property owners or occupants not less than two (2) hours prior to beginning an open burn.
- Only burn landscape material that is completely dry and free from non-organic debris.
- Open burning is prohibited on Village roadways, sidewalks and other right-of-ways.
- Accelerants shall not be used in aiding the burning of leaves.
- Open leaf burning fires must be at least fifty (50) feet from structures and property lines.
- Never burn when the wind speed is below 5 m.p.h. or over 15 m.p.h.
- All fires must be constantly attended with some type of extinguishing device such as a garden hose or fire extinguisher.
- Open leaf burning is prohibited on any federal or state holiday.
- The open burning of leaves shall only occur between the time of sunrise and sunset.

Residents are reminded there is an alternative to leaf burning. Yard waste can be picked up by Homewood Disposal on your regular pickup day from April 1 through November 30 at no extra cost.

## PROTECT YOUR INVESTMENT!

The Village has adopted by ordinance a set of Building Codes to protect homeowners and the public against unsafe building practices, unscrupulous contractors, and potential health and safety hazards. State legislation also mandates energy saving requirements and state contractor licenses for certain types of work. In accordance with the Building Code, the Village requires permits for, but not limited to, the following work.

- Siding/Roofs/Gutters
- Decks
- Sheds/Garages
- Additions/Remodeling
- Fireplaces
- Pools
- Fences
- Solar/Wind Systems
- Windows/Exterior Doors
- Electrical Service Upgrades
- Hot Tubs/Saunas
- Exterior Flatwork & Concrete
- Asphalt & Paver Stone
- Irrigation Sprinklers

Protect your biggest investment by making sure you obtain your building permit prior to starting your home improvement project. If your construction project does not comply with the codes adopted by Homer Glen, your investment value could be reduced and property insurers may not cover work done without permits and inspections. Also, make sure you are hiring licensed contractors to perform the work. Violations are also subject to fines and compliance satisfaction.

## CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT FOR EXCELLENCE IN FINANCIAL REPORTING

The Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting is the highest form of recognition in the area of government accounting and financial reporting. Recently, the Village of Homer Glen received our 16th straight CAFR Award from the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States (GFOA). The Village's financial reports have been judged, by an impartial GFOA panel, to meet the highest possible standards. 




# HOW WELL DO YOU KNOW HOMER GLEN?

Homer Glen is a village, located 32 miles (51 km) southwest of downtown Chicago, in Homer Township, Will County, Illinois. The village was incorporated on April 17, 2001.

Homer Glen's gently rolling terrain is dotted with prairie grasses, stands of trees and cultivated fields. The Forest Preserve District of Will County has over 1,300 acres of land within the Village, including the Forest Preserve District's only equestrian trail.



## homer (n.)

The Village borrowed the name "Homer" from the Township in which the Village resides. Homer Township was named by Alanson Granger in honor of his native home, Homer, New York, when the Township was settled in the 1830's.

## glen (n.)

A glen is a small, narrow secluded valley. The word was chosen as part of the Village's name in honor of the topography in this area.

Homer Glen is one of Will County's largest municipalities. Upon incorporation, the Village encompassed about 19.9 square miles. Currently, the Village encompasses more than 22 square miles.

### Population & Housing

Based upon the 2017 U.S. Census Bureau estimates, the Village's total population is 24,591. Homer Glen has 8,397 housing units, with an average of 2.90 residents per household. Over 93% of the homes in the Village are owner occupied.

### Income, Education & Age Group

The median household income in Homer Glen is \$97,254. Nearly 95% of Village residents aged 25 years or older are high-school graduates, with 39.3% of those residents holding a bachelor's degree or higher. The median age, as of 2015, in Homer Glen is 44.2 years old.



# HOMER TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT



## *Riding The Roads Through Homer Glen*

The Road District will begin fall with street sweeping the curbed-roads in mid-September but must stop when the leaves begin to fall. The Street Sweeper is not designed to pick up leaves, as it clogs. We are still in the process of trimming trees that would prevent us from plowing the snow to the edge of the road.

The infrastructure portion of the IDOT project on 159th Street should be completed in early October and both eastbound and westbound lanes should be open; the landscaping portion of the project will commence in the spring.

This year we are adding a new plow route, a driver, and two new plow trucks making us more efficient. This should eliminate the need to shut down routes to repair plow trucks during a winter event.

The Road District prepares for winter by applying an anti-icing coating of brine (saltwater) to the roads before the first winter weather event. When it dries a light coating of salt is left that alleviates the bonding of snow and ice to the asphalt. It is also applied periodically throughout the winter season, as necessary. It will be used primarily on our arterial roads and bridges.



### **WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT SNOW AND ROADS!**

1. We have a 15-person crew working around the clock during winter storms. Most weather events require many man hours to address. We thank you for your patience!
2. The Village of Homer Glen is strictly enforcing the no-parking ordinance for two or more inches of snow. Keep those parked cars off the street during a storm!
3. It is now illegal to plow, snow-blow or shovel snow from your property onto the roadway.
4. The Road District must plow until the streets are cleared of snow. Please excuse us if we plow snow onto your driveway. It is unavoidable.
5. An average winter will have 25 weather events and every event will average 4 trips down every road in a route to properly clear the snow. That's an average of 100 trips down every road every winter season!



# WILL COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE CORNER

*Homer Glen 4th Safest Place To Live In Illinois*



Sheriff Mike Kelley and the Will County Sheriff's Office are honored to serve and protect the Village of Homer Glen. Will County was formed in 1836. From humble beginnings, the Will County Sheriff's Office has since grown to over 600 employees and serves one of the fastest growing counties in the country. By law, the Sheriff's Office is the custodian of the Will County courthouse and jail, serves and executes warrants, processes orders and judgements, is the conservator of the peace, and the Sheriff is the supervisor of public safety.

The Sheriff's Office has been serving the Village of Homer Glen since 2000. Deputies, Sergeants, a traffic deputy, and a Lieutenant are dedicated to Homer Glen for day-to-day operations. This includes, responding to calls for service, conducting business checks, patrolling subdivisions, traffic enforcement, school checks, and other various duties.

The public does not often see the vast resources the Sheriff's Office has in support of the operations in Homer Glen. These include the following divisions: investigations, crime scene investigations, warrants, gang unit, SWAT, auxiliary, records, traffic, training, and the K-9 unit, to name a few. In addition,

there is material support. Some examples are vehicle maintenance, payroll, public affairs, records division, and numerous secretarial and support staff.

The Will County Sheriff's Office mission is the protection of human life, the reduction of crime, and providing and maintaining a safe, peaceful environment in which constitutional rights are safeguarded. This is accomplished in Homer Glen by working with the community, other public service entities, local governing bodies, and businesses. This partnership resulted in Homer Glen being rated the 4th safest place to live in Illinois in 2018.

The Sheriff's Office substation is located at 14240 W. 151st Street. The station is not manned 24 hours per day, but is utilized for roll call meetings, training, report writing, and processing arrestees. In an emergency, dial 9-1-1. For non-emergency calls dial 815-727-8575 and follow the prompts.

# FIRE DISTRICT CORNER

## *Fire Safety In The Glen*



Welcome to the Fire Districts section. Back in the 1950's long before the Village was incorporated, the Fire Districts were formed as separate taxing bodies to make sure all the residents were protected. A Fire District is its own taxing entity that has its own board of Trustees to oversee the Districts. When the Village of Homer Glen boundaries were established, the land was within five different Fire Districts with Homer Township and Northwest Homer covering the majority of the Village. There are parts in the south end of the Village within the Orland, Mokena and New Lenox Fire Districts. If you are not sure of your Fire District, check your property tax bill and you will see what District you are in. Even though the names of the Fire Districts match some of the cities around us, none of them are funded by the villages or cities.

Since the Fire Districts have all been established for many years and have worked together on mutual aid agreements, the Districts all respond to emergencies and trainings together to provide the best service to all the residents. It is normal to see units from any of the Districts at an emergency within the Village. All of the Fire Districts provide 24-hour staffed fire stations with Firefighter/Paramedics that respond to many types of emergencies. Please do not hesitate to call 9-1-1 if you have an emergency.
