## **SPECIAL PROVISIONS**

The following Special Provisions supplement the "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction," adopted January 1, 2012, the latest edition of the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways," and the "Manual of Test Procedures for Materials" in effect on the date of invitation for bids, and the Supplemental Specifications and Recurring Special Provisions indicated on the Check Sheet included herein, and the Standard Specifications for Water and Sewer Main Construction in Illinois, latest edition, which apply to and govern the construction of Section 15-00000-01-GM, Village of Homer Glen, Will County; and in case of conflict with any part or parts of said Specifications, the said Special Provisions shall take precedence and shall govern.

### **LOCATION OF PROJECT**

The maintenance of existing Village street lighting systems is located at various streets within the Village of Homer Glen, Will County, Illinois.

### **DURATION OF CONTRACT**

This contract will be in full force from 12:01 A.M., May 1, 2015, to 12:00 Midnight, April 30, 2016, subject to the right of the Village of Homer Glen to cancel or terminate the same at any time with or without cause for reasons which it believes to be in the public interest by giving thirty (30) days notice to the Contractor. In the event of such cancellation, the Contractor shall be entitled to receive payment for services and work performed and materials furnished under the terms of the Contract prior to the effective date of such cancellation, but shall not be entitled to receive any damages on account of such cancellations or any further payment whatsoever.

The Village of Homer Glen also reserves the right to extend this Contract for a period of between one (1) and two (2) years, under the same terms and conditions as the original Contract, upon thirty (30) days notice in writing of its intention to exercise this option. The Contractor shall have the privilege of rejecting an extension of the Contract period. Such rejection shall be made in writing to the Village prior to the expiration of the Contract period and shall state the unwillingness to continue under the same terms and conditions.

### **TRAFFIC CONTROL AND PROTECTION**

All roads shall be kept open to traffic. The Contractor should take particular note of the applicable portions of Article 107.14 of the Standard Specifications. All signs, except those referring to daily lane closures, shall be post mounted in accordance with Standard 701901 for all projects that exceed four-day duration. Construction signs referring to daytime lane closures during working hours shall be removed, covered or turned away from the view of the motorists during non-working hours.

The Contractor shall furnish, erect, maintain and remove all signs, barricades, flaggers and other traffic control devices as may be necessary for the purpose of regulating, warning or guiding traffic. Placement and maintenance of all traffic control devices shall be in accordance with the applicable parts of Section 701 of the Standard Specifications, the Illinois Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways and the Highway Standard contained herein.

Special attention is called to Article 107.09 and Section 701 of the Standard Specifications and the following Highways Standards, Supplemental Specifications, Details, Quality Standard for Work Zone

Traffic Control Devices, Recurring Special Provisions, and Special Provisions contained herein relating to traffic control. It should be noted that Type I or Type II barricades will be required adjacent to the pavement in areas where a drop off of 3" or more occurs in accordance with Article 701.07.

The Contractor shall contact the Village of Homer Glen at least 72 hours in advance of beginning work. Construction operations shall be conducted in a manner such that streets will be open to traffic at all times, and access to abutting property shall be maintained.

The Contractor shall be responsible for providing a proposed scheduling, phasing and traffic control plan. The Village will review these plans and provide the contractor with any necessary modifications in writing. The Contractor will then be responsible for incorporating these changes into the proposed scheduling, phasing and traffic control plan.

At the preconstruction meeting, the Contractor shall furnish the name and telephone number where he may be reached during non-working hours of the individual in his direct employ that is to be responsible for the installation and maintenance of the traffic control of this project. If the actual installation and maintenance are to be accomplished by a subcontractor, consent shall be requested of the Engineer at the time of the preconstruction meeting in accordance with Article 108.01 of the Standard Specifications. This shall not relieve the Contractor of the requirements to have a responsible individual in his direct employ supervise this work.

This work will not be paid for separately but included in the cost of the contract.

**PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND SAFETY (D-1)**

Effective: May 1, 2012

Revised: July 15, 2012

Add the following to the end of the fourth paragraph of Article 107.09:

"If the holiday is on a Saturday or Sunday, and is legally observed on a Friday or Monday, the length of Holiday Period for Monday or Friday shall apply."

Add the following sentence after the Holiday Period table in the fourth paragraph of Article 107.09:

"The Length of Holiday Period for Thanksgiving shall be from 5:00 AM the Wednesday prior to 11:59 PM the Sunday After"

Delete the fifth paragraph of Article 107.09 of the Standard Specifications:

"On weekends, excluding holidays, roadways with Average Daily Traffic of 25,000 or greater, all lanes shall be open to traffic from 3:00 P.M. Friday to midnight Sunday except where structure construction or major rehabilitation makes it impractical."

### **APPLICATION FOR PAYMENT**

Application for payment to the Contractor shall be in accordance with the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

The Contractor shall procure from each subcontractor and supplier of material or labor a waiver of any claim which they may have under the mechanics lien laws of the state in which the work is located, to insure the Village immunity from mechanics liens on subcontractors in carrying out the contract and any work orders for additions thereto, all as a condition of any payment by the Village. Any payments made by the Village without requiring compliance with this paragraph shall not be construed as a Waiver by the Village of the right to require compliance with this paragraph as a condition to later payments.

The Contractor shall submit Partial Waivers of Lien from all subcontractors and suppliers with each partial payment estimate and Contractor's Affidavit for subcontractors and suppliers with second payment request for the previous payment estimates and then with all subsequent payment estimates. The Contractor shall furnish with his final application for payment a complete release of all liens arising out of this contract, or receipts in full in lieu thereof and an affidavit that the releases and receipts include all labor and material for which a lien could be filed.

### **PROTECTION AND RESTORATION OF PROPERTY**

The Contractor shall take all necessary precautions for the protection of public and private property. The Contractor is responsible for the damage or destruction of property resulting from neglect, misconduct, or omission in his/her manner of method of execution or non-execution of the work or caused by defective work, or the use of unsatisfactory materials or equipment, and such responsibility shall not be released until the work has been completed and accepted and the requirements of these specifications complied with.

Whenever public or private property is so damaged or destroyed, the Contractor shall, at his/her expense, restore such property to a condition equal to that which existed prior to such damage or injury by repairing, rebuilding, or replacing it as may be directed, or he/she shall otherwise make good such damage or destruction in an acceptable manner. If he/she fails to do so, the Village will withhold any payouts toward completed work until arrangements are made to correct any damage as described above.

### **ROUTINE MAINTENANCE OF EXISTING STREET LIGHTS**

This work is listed as follows, and shall constitute the general responsibility to be assumed by the Contractor in carrying out the provisions in the Contract, for which no extra charge will be allowed.

- a. Replace any burned out lamps that are discovered or reported by the Village no later than five (5) working days from when they were reported. At the time of replacement of burned out, broken, or missing lamps, reflectors, and glassware shall be cleaned
- b. Notify the Village when replacing any lamps that have been damaged by vandalism, by way of a monthly report sheet
- c. Keep light standards, brackets, luminaires and foundations tight and in alignment at all times
- d. Check handhole covers on posts to ascertain if in place and tight, and replace same if missing
- e. Keep luminaires properly adjusted in relation to center line of pavement at all times to give correct distribution of light
- f. Properly maintain the service pole and equipment mounted thereon, such as primary control switches and protective relays and all appurtenances thereto, at all time
- g. Keep power distribution centers clean, and dress or replace all switch contacts located in same, when necessary

- h. Maintain proper fusing for the various lighting circuits and keep time clocks and photo-electric relay controls and ballasts in proper operating order at all times
- i. Replace all burned out or damaged lamps or replace luminaires whenever necessary, regardless of cause, and properly dispose of old lamps
- j. All damaged, defective, or worn equipment that cannot be rebuilt or reused and has no salvage value to the Village, shall be disposed of by the Contractor at his expense, unless directed by the Village to return equipment to the Owner
- k. Repair or replace any part or parts of the system, except lamps and luminaires (listed in "l" above), damaged from any cause whatsoever including vandalism, except damage due to vehicular accident, damage from party engaged in construction on a public right-of-way, or extensive damage resulting from major disasters such as fire, floods, or any other catastrophic event.

The Village of Homer Glen has an inventory of 627 street lights that will be maintained under the above terms of the special provision. The breakdown of type of pole luminaire is as follows:

- Post Top (96 "Collie Style" and 138 Salem) = 234 Each
- Flat Lens = 265 Each
- Cobra Head Drop Lens = 37 Each
- Lumec Style = 82 Each
- Globe Style = 9 Each

Basis of Payment: This work shall be paid for at the contract unit price EACH PER MONTH for "ROUTINE MAINTENANCE OF EXISTING STREET LIGHTS", which shall include all labor, material, and equipment to complete the work as specified above.

#### **EXTRA WORK**

The Village of Homer Glen may authorize the Contractor to perform extra work and furnish the necessary materials and parts. The Contractor shall submit an estimate for the extra work requested by the Village and upon written approval from the Village; the Contractor shall perform the work as specified in the original request.

This work shall be paid for separately from the items listed in the Schedule of Prices.

## Explanations

WILL COUNTY

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

## EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

#### CERAMIC TILE FINISHER

The grouting, cleaning, and polishing of all classes of tile, whether for interior or exterior purposes, all burned, glazed or unglazed products; all composition materials, granite tiles, warning detectable tiles, cement tiles, epoxy composite materials, pavers, glass, mosaics, fiberglass, and all substitute materials, for tile made in tile-like units; all mixtures in tile like form of cement, metals, and other materials that are for and intended for use as a finished floor surface, stair treads, promenade roofs, walks, walls, ceilings, swimming pools, and all other places where tile is to form a finished interior or exterior. The mixing of all setting mortars including but not limited to thin-set mortars, epoxies, wall mud, and any other sand and cement mixtures or adhesives when used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. The handling and unloading of all sand, cement, lime, tile, fixtures, equipment, adhesives, or any other materials to be used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. Ceramic Tile Finishers shall fill all joints and voids regardless of method on all tile work, particularly and especially after installation of said tile work. Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

#### COMMUNICATIONS TECHNICIAN

Installation, operation, inspection, maintenance, repair and service of radio, television, recording, voice, sound and vision production and reproduction, telephone and telephone interconnect, facsimile, equipment and appliances used for domestic, commercial, educational and entertainment purposes, pulling of wire through conduit but not the installation of conduit.

#### MARBLE FINISHER

Loading and unloading trucks, distribution of all materials (all stone, sand, etc.), stocking of floors with material, performing all rigging for heavy work, the handling of all material that may be needed for the installation of such materials, building of scaffolding, polishing if needed, patching, waxing of material if damaged, pointing up, caulking, grouting and cleaning of marble, holding water on diamond or Carborundum blade or saw for setters cutting, use of tub saw or any other saw needed for preparation of material, drilling of holes for wires that anchor material set by setters, mixing up of molding plaster for installation of material, mixing up thin set for the installation of material, mixing up of sand to cement for the installation of material and such other work as may be required in helping a Marble Setter in the handling of all material in the erection or installation of interior marble, slate, travertine, art marble, serpentine, alberene stone, blue stone, granite and other stones (meaning as to stone any foreign or domestic materials as are specified and used in building interiors and exteriors and customarily known as stone in the trade), carrara, sanionyx, vitrolite and similar opaque glass and the laying of all marble tile, terrazzo tile, slate tile and precast tile, steps, risers treads, base, or any other materials that may be used as substitutes for any of the aforementioned materials and which are used on interior and exterior which are installed in a similar manner.

MATERIAL TESTER I: Hand coring and drilling for testing of materials; field inspection of uncured concrete and asphalt.

MATERIAL TESTER II: Field inspection of welds, structural steel, fireproofing, masonry, soil, facade, reinforcing steel, formwork, cured concrete, and concrete and asphalt batch plants; adjusting proportions of bituminous mixtures.

Leverman (Hydraulic Dredge); Diver Tender.

Class 3. Deck Equipment Operator, Machineryman, Maintenance of Crane (over 50 ton capacity) or Backhoe (115,000 lbs. or more); Tug/Launch Operator; Loader/Dozer and like equipment on Barge, Breakwater Wall, Slip/Dock, or Scow, Deck Machinery, etc.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Class 1. Two or three Axle Trucks. A-frame Truck when used for transportation purposes; Air Compressors and Welding Machines, including those pulled by cars, pick-up trucks and tractors; Ambulances; Batch Gate Lockers; Batch Hopperman; Car and Truck Washers; Carry-alls; Fork Lifts and Hoisters; Helpers; Mechanics Helpers and Greasers; Oil Distributors 2-man operation; Pavement Breakers; Pole Trailer, up to 40 feet; Power Mower Tractors; Self-propelled Chip Spreader; Skipman; Slurry Trucks, 2-man operation; Slurry Truck Conveyor Operation, 2 or 3 man; Teamsters; Unskilled Dumpman; and Truck Drivers hauling warning lights, barricades, and portable toilets on the job site.

Four axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors under 7 yards; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnapulls or Turnatrailers when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment under 16 cubic yards; Mixer Trucks under 7 yards; Ready-mix Plant Hopper Operator, and Winch Trucks, 2 Axles.

Class 3. Five axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors 7 yards and over; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnatrailers or turnapulls when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment over 16 cubic yards; Explosives and/or Fission Material Trucks; Mixer Trucks 7 yards or over; Mobile Cranes while in transit; Oil Distributors, 1-man operation; Pole Trailer, over 40 feet; Pole and Expandable Trailers hauling material over 50 feet long; Slurry trucks, 1-man operation; Winch trucks, 3 axles or more; Mechanic--Truck Welder and Truck Painter.

Class 4. Six axle trucks; Dual-purpose vehicles, such as mounted crane trucks with hoist and accessories; Foreman; Master Mechanic; Self-loading equipment like P.B. and trucks with scoops on the front.

TERRAZZO FINISHER

The handling of sand, cement, marble chips, and all other materials that may be used by the Mosaic Terrazzo Mechanic, and the mixing, grinding, grouting, cleaning and sealing of all Marble, Mosaic, and Terrazzo work, floors, base, stairs, and wainscoting by hand or machine, and in addition, assisting and aiding Marble, Masonic, and Terrazzo Mechanics.

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the

Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

#### LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.

#### MATERIAL TESTER & MATERIAL TESTER/INSPECTOR I AND II

Notwithstanding the difference in the classification title, the classification entitled "Material Tester I" involves the same job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector I". Likewise, the classification entitled "Material Tester II" involves the same job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector II".
