

# WILL COUNTY

Vaccination Plan - Phase 1 Overview

## INTRODUCTION

Will County is working diligently to vaccinate all residents against COVID-19. More than 40 different providers are working in conjunction with the Health Department to provide this vaccine to anyone living or working in Will County who is interested.

## THE PROCESS

- Complete the pre-registration form on the Health Department website.
- Will County Health Department will contact individuals to schedule appointments.

## WHERE WE ARE TODAY

*Week of January 25th*

Most of 1a has been completed and the Health Department, along with other providers, have begun to vaccinate populations of 1b on January 25.

## DATA

29,764 doses have been administered

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8,087 people have been fully vaccinated

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1.17% of the population has been vaccinated to date.

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Will County is currently ranked #4 in the State for amount of vaccine administered.

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The first shipment of Pfizer arrived on December 16. This went directly to hospitals in Will County.

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Will County Health Department was able to start vaccination clinics on January 4, and began vaccinating the remainder of Phase 1a.

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## UPDATES

- Will County is expanding the capacity of the current appointment system to meet increasing demands.
- Many of the groups identified in 1b have been contacted. As vaccines become available, they are being notified to schedule appointments.
- Illinois Department of Public Health has announced it will be releasing version 5.0 of the State Mass Vaccination Plan. This will provide more details on groups in Phases 1b and 1c.

## EXAMPLE OF VACCINE SHIPMENT

Health Department receives 3,000 doses.

- Approximately 60% (1,800 doses) are allocated to various providers.
- Roughly 40% (900) may be reserved for the "second dose".
- 300 "first dose" appointments can be made at the Health Department.

## TRANSITION MILESTONES

When demand in the current phase appears to have been met (e.g. appointments for vaccination are less than 80% filled for several days).

OR

When supply of authorized vaccine increases substantially.

OR

When most people in the current phase are vaccinated.

OR

When vaccine supply within a certain location is in danger of going unused unless vaccination is expanded to persons in the next phase.
