RIDER A

The Village of Homer Glen, (hereinafter referred to interchangeably as "Owner" or "Village"), and Lyons Pinner Electric Co., (hereinafter referred to interchangeably as "Company" or "Organization" or "Contractor"), hereby acknowledge and agree that this RIDER A is hereby incorporated into the General Terms and Conditions for Contractors as if fully set forth therein. The Parties acknowledge that this RIDER A, and the General Terms and Conditions for Contractors shall constitute the full and complete understanding between the Parties, **and the Parties further agree that to whatever extent the terms and provisions of this RIDER A conflict with the terms and provisions of the General Terms and Conditions for Contractors, the terms and provisions of this RIDER A shall control.** The Parties understand and agree that this RIDER A and the General Terms and Conditions for Contractors, shall constitute the full Agreement between the Parties, and is referred to hereinafter as the "Agreement".

I. Insurance:

The Company agrees to procure and obtain insurance issued by a company or companies qualified to do business in the State of Illinois and provide the Village with evidence of credible insurance, in the following types and amounts:

- a) Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability with limits not less than:
 - 1. Worker's Compensation: Statutory;
 - 2. Employer's Liability;
 - 3. \$1,000,000 injury-per occurrence
 - 4. Such insurance must evidence that coverage applies in the State of Illinois.

- b) Comprehensive Motor Vehicle Liability with limits for vehicles owned, non-owned or rented not less than:
Bodily Injury/Property Damage: Combined Single Limit: \$1,000,000 per accident.

c) Comprehensive General Liability with coverage written on an "occurrence" as is and with limits no less than:

1. Each Occurrence: \$ 1,000,000
2. General Aggregate: \$2,000,000
3. Products and completed operations:
General Aggregate: \$2,000,000

d) Rating. Umbrella Policy. The required coverages may be in any combination of primary, excess, and umbrella policies. Any excess or umbrella policy must provide excess coverage over underlying insurance on a following-form basis such that when any loss covered by the primary policy exceeds the limits under the primary policy, the excess or umbrella policy becomes effective to cover such loss. This policy must apply to the Commercial General Liability and Motor Vehicle Coverage. Minimum amount \$5,000,000 in combination. An exception for a lower limit may be granted at the discretion of the Village of Homer Glen. Such an exception could be based upon other criteria such as a review of their safety record, information provided by references, and/or any established prior history. Company agrees to name the Village of Homer Glen, its officers, officials, Village President, Board of Trustees, agents, employees, representatives, volunteers, and attorneys, as additional insureds on the Comprehensive General Liability, Comprehensive Motor Vehicle Liability and Umbrella/Excess Policies. Company agrees to provide insurance with an endorsement naming the Village of Homer Glen and its officers, officials, Village President, Board of Trustees, agents, employees, representatives, volunteers, and attorneys as additional insureds. Company ~~further~~ agrees that all insurance policies are to be placed with insurers authorized to conduct business in the state with a current A.M. Best rating of no less than A:VII, unless otherwise acceptable to the Village.

e) Other Insurance Provisions:

The insurance policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

1. The Village of Homer Glen, and its officers, officials, Village President, Board of Trustees, agents, employees, representatives, volunteers, and attorneys are to be covered as additional insureds on the general liability, auto and umbrella/excess policies. An endorsement naming the above as additional insureds, on a primary, noncontributory basis, must be submitted with the Certificate(s) of Insurance.

2. For any claims related to this Agreement, the insurance coverage must be primary insurance coverage at least as broad as ISO

CG 20 01 04 13, as it relates to the additional insureds. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Village, its officers, officials, employees, volunteers and attorneys, must be in excess of the Company's insurance, and not contributory with or to the Company's insurance. Company must procure and maintain for the duration of the Agreement, and for 2 years thereafter, insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the services hereunder by the Company, its agents, authorized contractors, vendors, representatives, employees, and any sub-Companies.

3. The insurance shall contain no special limitation on the scope of protection afforded the Village, and shall contain a "contractual liability" clause. Athletic participation must not be excluded.

4. Insurance coverage shall waive all rights of subrogation against the Village.

II. Indemnification:

To the maximum extent permissible by law, Organization shall protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Village of Homer Glen, and its officers, officials, Village President, Board of Trustees, agents, employees, representatives, volunteers, and attorneys, (hereinafter referred to collectively as "Indemnitees"), from and against any and all claims, demands, losses, damages, causes of action, suits, and liability of every kind, including but not limited to all litigation expenses, court costs, expert fees, and attorneys' fees, ("hereinafter collectively referred to as Claims") for any injury to or death of any person, and any loss of or damage to any property that: (1) is caused, in whole or part by (i) the Organization, (ii) any sub-Organization, (iii) Organization's contractor or subcontractor; or (iv) any third-party; and/or (2) caused in part by the Village and any of the other Indemnitees. Nothing herein shall be construed as to require Organization to indemnify the Indemnitees from any and all claims, damages, losses or expenses caused by the Indemnitees' sole negligence. The Organization's obligations to protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or otherwise reduce any other right or obligations that the Organization may have to protect, defend, indemnify, and hold harmless, which would otherwise exist as to any party or person described in this Paragraph.

The Organization shall also protect, defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the Indemnitees from any and all claims, demands, losses, damages, causes of action, suits, and liability of every kind, including but not limited to all litigation expenses, court costs, expert fees, and attorneys' fees, incurred by the Village or any of the Other Indemnitees, by reason of Company's breach of any of its obligations under, or Company's default of any provision of this

Agreement.

III. Project Details, Terms and Provisions:

The Parties hereby agree and acknowledge that Sections, II, IV, VII, VIII and Exhibit A, of the “RFP: Village of Homer Glen – Heritage Park Cul-de-sac Lighting” attached hereto as Exhibit 1, is hereby incorporated into this Section III, in their entirety, as if fully set forth herein; and that the Parties mutually agree to bound by all terms, provisions, duties, obligations, conditions, specifications, project details, and scope of work set forth therein.

IV. Miscellaneous Terms & Provisions:

- a) If any provision of this Agreement is declared invalid, illegal, or incapable of being enforced by any Court of competent jurisdiction, all of the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and no provision shall be deemed dependent upon any other provision unless so expressed herein.
- b) The Parties to this Agreement agree and acknowledge that the terms and provisions herein shall not be construed against either Party, as the drafter or primary drafter of this Agreement.
- c) Company has not relied on any oral statements that are not included in this Agreement. This Agreement supersedes all prior agreements and understandings concerning the subject matter of this Agreement.
- d) This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois, without regard to its conflict of law provisions. Any legal action or proceeding relating to this Agreement shall be instituted in the Circuit Court of Will County, Illinois. The parties agree to submit to the jurisdiction of, and agree that venue is proper in, said court in any such legal action or proceeding.
- e) This Agreement may be executed in counterparts. Electronically executed copies are deemed to be the equivalent of physically signed originals. However, no signature shall be binding upon any one Party, unless all of the signatures to this Settlement and Agreement are duly executed by all Parties.



Section I: Overview

The Village of Homer Glen is seeking proposals from qualified contractors for the installation of lighting along the Village's Cul-de-sac Road located in Heritage Park at 14240 W. 151st Street in Homer Glen, Illinois.

Prior to the submission deadline, the Village will make available to the public answers to questions or any modifications or additions to this RFP in the form of a written Addendum which will be posted on the Village website by **April 7th** (4/7/2025).

No verbal/oral comments will be made to any Proposer as to the meaning of the RFP, Specifications or other contract documents. Answers will be provided in writing to all potential Proposers. **Proposers are required to acknowledge receipt of any formal Addendum by signing the Addendum and including it with the submission.**

Proposals must be submitted no later than 3:00pm, local time, on **Friday, April 11th, 2025** (4/11/2025). Proposals received after this date and time will not be accepted; all proposals received after the submittal deadline will be rejected and returned unopened. Proposals must include all information and documents as requested in this Request for Proposal, failure to follow these instructions may result in rejection of the proposal.

The Village of Homer Glen reserves the right to reject any and all proposals and void any irregularities. Proposals will be opened and evaluated in private and proposal information will be kept confidential until an award is made.

Section II: Project Details

Community Profile

Homer Glen, Illinois, is a home-rule community of 24,664 residents located in northeastern Will County, approximately 25 miles southwest of Chicago. The Village was incorporated on April 17, 2001 and is home to a unique blend of open space, residential developments and vibrant commercial corridors. Homer Glen is one of Will County's largest municipalities encompassing more than 22 square miles.

Scope of Services

Provide labor, material, equipment and all related services required to complete the installation of lighting along the Heritage Park Cul-de-sac road as detailed in the plans and special provisions included as Exhibit A and as specified herein.

The Village owns and will provide the light poles, luminaires and electrical cable required for installation of the lighting.

The contractor shall provide the following, including but not limited to, conduit, handholes, photocells or nodes, light pole foundations and all other material, manpower or equipment required to install the lighting as shown in the plans and special provisions attached as Exhibit A.

Section III: Proposal Submission Requirements

Proposers shall complete and submit the requested forms included in Sections VII – X. The Village will only accept proposals in bound hard copy format and does not accept proposals submitted via fax, email, or other electronic means.

Each bid shall be accompanied by a Bid Guarantee in the form of a Bid Bond from a company with an A-1 best rating, or a cashier's check in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the total amount of the proposal and made payable to the Village of Homer Glen, 14240

W. 151st Street, Homer Glen IL 60491. No bid shall be withdrawn for a period of forty-five (45) days after the bid opening date without consent of the Village. Checks or drafts of unsuccessful bidders will be returned as soon as possible after the opening of bids.

The successful bidder must provide proper insurance acceptable to the Village. Each contractor is to submit their bid as indicated in Section VI and include all signed supporting documentation.

Section IV: General Terms and Conditions

Award

The following terms and conditions must be met in the Proposer's preparation of and the Village's consideration of each submittal:

1. Compliance with Laws:

All services of any qualifying Proposer shall comply with all Federal and State of Illinois laws, county and municipal codes, ordinances, rules and regulations that in any manner affect the services to be provided or the operations of the firm, including, but not limited to, the Prevailing Wage Act, the Illinois Procurement Code, and all laws governing employment.
 - b. 



SPECIAL PROVISIONS

(REVISED 3/31/2025, revisions have been indicated by ** before and after the revised text)

The following Special Provisions supplement the Illinois Department of Transportation's (IDOT) "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction," adopted January 1, 2022, (hereinafter referred to as the "Standard Specifications"); the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways" the "Manual of Test Procedures of Materials", in effect on the date of invitation for bids; the "Supplemental Specifications and Recurring Special Provisions," adopted January 1, 2023 which apply to and govern the improvements of Proposed Lighting at Heritage Park Cul-de-sac Road, Homer Glen, Will County, Illinois. In case of conflict with any or parts of said Specifications, the said Special Provisions shall take precedence and shall govern.

LOCATION OF PROJECT

This project consists of installing street lighting for the newly constructed cul-de-sac road located within Heritage Park in the Village of Homer Glen, Will County, Illinois as shown on the location map and in the project plans.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT

The work shall include installation of street lighting for the Heritage Park Cul-de-sac Road, and all incidental work necessary to complete improvements as described herein.

REDUCTION IN THE SCOPE OF WORK

Due to budgetary constraints the Village reserves the right to reduce the scope of work to be completed under the contract beyond the limits specified in with Article 104.02 of the Standard Specifications. No allowance will be made for delay or anticipated profits as the result of a decrease in the quantities of work to be performed.

COMPLETION DATE

Revise Article 108.05 (a) of the Standard Specifications as follows:

"When a completion date is specified, the Contractor shall complete all contract items by 11:59 PM on June 20th, 2025."

It is understood that TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE IN THIS CONTRACT, and the Contractor agrees to begin actual work covered by this contract after notification by the Village to commence work and to prosecute the same with all due diligence so as to complete the entire work by the specific completion date. It may be necessary for the Contractor to work longer hours, use additional crews and/or work during weekends in order to complete work within the required time limit. The

Contractor shall submit a Critical Path Method (CPM) Progress Schedule at the preconstruction meeting for the Engineer's approval before work can be started.

The Contractor will not be allowed any extra compensation for working longer hours or using extra shifts, working on weekends or during holidays, etc. to meet the specified completion date.

The Contractor will be allowed to complete all clean-up work and punch list items within 5 working days after the final completion date.

Should the Contractor fail to complete the work on or before the completion date as specified herein, or within such extended time as may be allowed by the Department, the Contractor shall be liable to the Village in the amount of \$2,500, not as penalty but as liquidated damages, for each calendar day or portion thereof of overrun in the contract time or such extended time as may be allowed.

In fixing the damages as set out herein, the desire is to establish a certain mode of calculation for the work since the Village's actual loss, in the event of delay, cannot be predetermined, would be difficult of ascertainment, and a matter of argument and unprofitable litigation. This said mode is an equitable rule for measurement of the Village's actual loss and fairly takes into account the loss of use of the roadway if the project is delayed in completion. The Village shall not be required to provide any actual loss in order to recover these liquidated damages provided herein, as said damages are very difficult to ascertain. Furthermore, no provision of this clause shall be construed as a penalty, as such is not the intention of the parties.

A calendar day is every day shown on the calendar and starts at 12:00 midnight and ends at the following 12:00 midnight, twenty-four hours later.

Article 108.09 or the Special Provision for "Failure to Complete the Work on Time", if included in this contract, shall apply to the completion date and the number of working days.

PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND SAFETY (D1)

ELECTRIC SERVICE SPLICE

Description: This item shall consist of all material and labor required to connect to the existing electrical feed located in a quazite box at the entrance to the cul-de-sac road.

Materials: Materials shall be in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

Construction Requirements: The Contractor shall provide all additional material and work not included by other contract pay items required to complete the electric service splice.

Method Of Measurement: Electric Service Splice shall be counted, each.

Basis Of Payment: This work will be paid for at the contract unit price EACH for ELECTRIC SERVICE SPLICE which shall be payment in full for the work specified herein.

ELECTRIC CABLE IN CONDUIT (SPECIAL)

Description: This item shall consist of installing electrical cables in raceways, complete with all splicing, identifications and terminations. The Village will furnish the appropriate gauge and length of electrical cable for the project. The cable is located at a Village storage facility off of Annico Drive

GFCI 15 AMP DUPLEX RECEPTACLE

The Contractor shall furnish and install a GFCI receptacle and weatherproof cover on proposed light poles as shown on the plans. Weatherproof cover shall be INTERMATIC In-Use Weatherproof Cover, manufacturer part number WP1010MXD.

This work will be paid for at the contract unit price per EACH for GFCI 15 AMP DUPLEX RECEPTACLE, which price shall include all labor, material, and equipment as specified above.

LIGHT POLE FOUNDATION, 24" DIAMETER

Description: This work shall consist of the installation of 24" diameter foundations for the proposed light poles.

The light poles are located at the Village of Homer Glen Public Works storage yard. The Contractor will be responsible for transporting the light poles to the jobsite. Luminaires are located at a Village storage facility at 15757 Annico Dr, Homer Glen, IL 60491. The Contractor will be responsible for transporting the luminaires to the jobsite. The Contractor shall give the Village a minimum 72 hours notice in advance of picking up the light poles or luminaires.

Basis of Payment: This work will be paid for at the contract unit price per EACH for LIGHTING UNIT (INSTALL ONLY). The price shall include preparation, labor, equipment tools and incidentals necessary to complete this item. Also included is the cost of transporting the material, feeder cable, conduit, mounting, connections and testing.

MODIFY EXISTING LIGHTING CONTROLLER

Description: This work shall consist of modifying the existing lighting controller to add two branch circuit breakers.

Construction Requirements: This work includes furnishing and installing the equipment as specified and as indicated in the plans. Two 20A single pole breakers shall be installed in the existing lighting controller. The existing equipment and wiring shall be adjusted to include the two circuit breakers and they shall be connected for 24-hour operation. These controller components and wiring shall be provided in accordance with Article 1068.01 (e) and (f) of the Standard Specifications.

This modification work shall be done in a manner that will not disrupt the nighttime operations of the existing lighting system.

Basis of Payment: This work will be paid for at the contract unit price per EACH for MODIFY EXISTING LIGHTING CONTROLLER. All parts, labor and equipment required for the completion of this work shall be included in this pay item.

WASHOUT BASIN


This work consists of installation, maintenance and subsequent removal and disposal of a concrete washout basin and shall be done in accordance with Sections 280 of the Standard Specifications and as shown on the plans. The washout basin shall be removed after concrete items have been installed.

A concrete washout basin shall be supplied as necessary to accommodate concrete delivery operations. No more than two (2) washout basins will be permitted without approval from the Engineer. The washout basin location(s) must be approved by the Engineer prior to installation.

This work will be paid for at the contract unit price per LUMP SUM for WASHOUT BASIN, which price shall include all labor, material, and equipment as specified above.




